Rationale

- (1) The T&D Insurance Group (the “Group”) has three core companies DAIDO LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY (“DAIDO LIFE”), TAIYO LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY (“TAIYO LIFE”) and T&D FINANCIAL LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY (“T&D FINANCIAL LIFE”), along with Pet & Family Insurance Co., Ltd., T&D Asset Management Co., Ltd., T&D United Capital Co., Ltd. and others, under the umbrella of T&D Holdings, Inc. (“T&D HD”). It has a large business scale next to that of Japan’s major life insurance groups; DAIDO LIFE is very strong in the SME market, TAIYO LIFE excels in the household market, and T&D FINANCIAL LIFE offers its products through financial institutions, independent agencies, etc. JCR deems the Group’s creditworthiness to be equivalent to the rating of AA, reflecting the solid business base that is diversified among the three core companies, stable earnings capacity, capital adequacy relative to risk, etc. Policy performance has been strong, and new business value is accumulating steadily. Accounting profits are also robust thanks partly to the successful diversification of earnings sources, including the overseas business. JCR is watching whether the Group can further enhance its market position and competitiveness and increase earnings capacity through the diversification of the business portfolio, advancement in integrated group management and so forth.
- (2) The Group’s market position and competitiveness are fairly strong. In the core domestic life insurance business, the three core companies are strengthening business bases by demonstrating their uniqueness and expertise in the respective markets where they have advantages. Moreover, they are not only working on the diversification and optimization of the business portfolio, including the

overseas business, and sophistication of ERM but are also increasing overall corporate value by, for instance, promoting integrated group management. Progress is being made in such initiatives as standardizing administrative and system functions within the Group, leveraging digital platforms and increasing contact points with customers, centering on pet insurance. Group synergies have also been realized, including collaborative asset management and mutual supply of insurance products in sales operations.

- (3) The Group's earnings capacity is fairly high. Policy performance has been strong thanks to effective sales activities and product launches. Adjusted profits remain on an uptrend partly because of a decrease in foreign currency hedging costs related to foreign bond investment and increase in positive spreads. The Group's MCEV has been constantly expanding with the accumulation of new business value and so forth. Whether the Group can steadily increase its MCEV through sales activities as shown in new business value, etc. while ensuring a risk-return balance, amid changes in the product mix, centering on protection-oriented products, will probably be the key to future rating decisions.
- (4) The Group is expanding the overseas closed-book business through T&D United Capital Co., Ltd. Equity-method affiliate FGH Parent, L.P. operates globally but mainly in the U.S. As a very recent event, the Group invested in Viridium Group GmbH & Co. KG, which operates primarily in Europe. Although one-time losses due to environmental changes including interest rates may be reported, these initiatives are contributing to the Group's overall profits to a certain extent. While the size of investment is expanding, business bases and earnings sources related to this business is expected to diversify. Risks are being controlled at acceptable levels under ERM and have not become excessive relative to the actual earnings capacity or the size of capital.
- (5) JCR deems the Group's capital adequacy to be commensurate with the AA rating category. ESR based on internal control, standing at 228% as of September 30, 2025, is at a level that allows the Group to fully maintain soundness even under considerable stress. The Group has established the ERM framework ahead of others, embedding risk-return management as part of its culture by utilizing the economic value-based evaluation in product strategies and asset management policies. Partly because DAIDO LIFE, which accounts for a majority of the interest rate risk amount of the entire Group, is continuing its moves to raise interest rate matching ratio between assets and liabilities, the sensitivity of ESR is tending to be reduced.

Issuer: T&D Holdings, Inc.

T&D HD is the Group's insurance holding company. Its issuer rating is deemed to be at the same level as the Group's creditworthiness. Given, among others, that double leverage ratio has been staying below a certain level and that stability in cash flow balance will likely be maintained into the future in light of the financial management policy, etc., JCR does not reflect the structural subordination of a holding company in the rating.

Issuer: DAIDO LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY

- (1) DAIDO LIFE is a core company in the Group. It has an extremely strong position and competitiveness in the SME market, backed by its alliances with such organizations as The National Federation of Corporate Taxpayers Associations, Tax Payment Associations, TKC National Federation and CPTA Cooperative Associations. Its issuer rating is deemed to be at the same level as the Group's creditworthiness in light of factors like DAIDO LIFE's position in the Group.
- (2) DAIDO LIFE mainly offers protection-oriented products, including the core term life insurance that covers the mortality risk of business owners as well as third-sector products to protect against the risk of disability to work due to serious diseases, etc. Having agencies like tax accountants and the in-house sales representative channel as primary sales channels, it has recently been expanding its customer base by combining these two channels to discover uninsured companies among the customers of tax accountants while also cultivating SMEs through the financial institution channel and so forth. Partly because of steady sales of tailor-made insurance products that can meet the diverse needs of business owners, policy performance has been strong, and new business value continues to improve. Although the levels of surrender and lapse rates are rising, they still remain low compared to before. JCR will watch whether DAIDO LIFE can keep expanding policies in force by promoting the sales of protection-oriented products for both corporate and individual customers.
- (3) In the product mix of policies in force, the proportion of third-sector products is increasing, while new business value keeps growing. Core profit has increased with the expansion of positive spreads, driven by interest rate hikes, etc. Even though DAIDO LIFE will incur greater business expenses due

to capital expenditures for a shift to a next-generation system, etc., it will still likely be able to secure steady profits, underpinned by a relatively large amount of mortality gains. In terms of asset management, although it is exposed to a certain amount of interest rate risk due to the duration gap between assets and liabilities, interest rate matching ratio has risen to a reasonable level through such measures as maintaining asset duration with the purchase of super-long-term bonds and pressing ahead with cash flow matching.

Issuer: TAIYO LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY

- (1) TAIYO LIFE is a core company in the Group. It secures a certain position and competitiveness in the household market by, for instance, offering protection insurance to elderly people and homemakers, as well as to their families. Its issuer rating is deemed to be at the same level as the Group's creditworthiness in light of factors like TAIYO LIFE's position in the Group.
- (2) Aside from its specialty in sales activities where in-house sales representatives visit households in pairs, TAIYO LIFE also engages in hybrid sales that integrate face-to-face and non-face-to-face approaches in response to changes in the social environment. While sales representatives have increased, their retention rate and productivity have improved thanks to the successful measures taken to upgrade the digital transformation strategy, including the adoption of AI, and enhancing sales support and training. Thanks in part to product development in response to changing customer needs, policy performance has been strong. Surrender and lapse rates are rising due in part to the cancellation of OTC products but still remain low compared to before.
- (3) As the product mix has changed with the sales of protection-oriented products such as those related to dementia, disability and nursing care, the percentage of protection-oriented products in policies in force has risen, especially for those in the third sector. A certain level of new business value is ensured. Core profit has improved with the expansion of positive spreads triggered by interest rate hikes, etc. TAIYO LIFE's profits have been underpinned by cost containment through operational streamlining and the drastic revision of the administrative system, where TAIYO LIFE has been working on for some time now. Duration of assets and liabilities is almost matched, and the economic value-based interest rate risk is under control.

Issuer: T&D FINANCIAL LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY

- (1) T&D FINANCIAL LIFE is a core company in the Group, playing the role of selling insurance through the agency channel such as financial institutions and walk-in insurance shops. Its issuer rating is deemed to be at the same level as the Group's creditworthiness in light of factors like T&D FINANCIAL LIFE's position in the Group.
- (2) The agency market has a certain scale and can be expected to keep growing into the future, but competition remains severe. Thanks to the launch and revision of the products that incorporate customer needs, improvement of the product lineup and other factors, annualized premiums of new policies have been on an uptrend. Sales are also robust for yen-denominated annuity insurance with a rise in domestic interest rates. Surrender and lapse rates are leveling off as of now. Thanks in part to a steady increase in policies in force, stable reporting of core profit is foreseeable. JCR will watch whether T&D FINANCIAL LIFE can further stabilize its earnings base by expanding policies in force through the development of products that meet customer needs, enhancement of the sales support system for agencies and so forth.
- (3) The Group is working as one to collaborate in such areas as product development and asset management. Initiatives to generate group synergies, including the sales of T&D FINANCIAL LIFE's products by DAIDO LIFE, are yielding positive results.

The Main Assumptions and Principles used in Constructing the Procedures and Methodologies used to Determine the Credit Rating as Required by Paragraph (a)(1)(ii)(C) of Rule 17g-7

- The credit rating methodology assumes, in principle, to be applied to assess the likelihood of a given debt payment in light of its issuer's condition and business environment, etc. in the relevant future. There is certain limitation, however, in the time horizon that the rating foresees.
- The credit rating methodology assumes, in principle, that the factors posted in the below are particularly important for such likelihood to be determined, and that the rating determination is made by evaluating each of them not only quantitatively but also employing qualitative analyses.

A) Business Bases

The likelihood of a given debt payment is highly conditional to its issuer's business bases - how they can be maintained/ expanded into the future and thereby secure earnings and cash flows in adequacy and in a sustainable way.

B) Financial Grounds and Asset Quality

The likelihood of debt payment is highly dependent on the degree of the issuer's indebtedness and loss absorption capacity in terms of equity capital. Also notable is that a financial institution might see a significant loss of financial grounds as a result of changes in value of the assets under its possession.

C) Liquidity Positions

The likelihood of debt payment is highly dependent on the adequacy of the issuer's cash and other sources of repayment (liquidity positions).

D) Related Parties' Status and Stance of Support/ Assistance for the Issuer

The likelihood of debt payment is affected one way or the other by the issuer's related parties such as parent company, subsidiary, guarantor, and the government of the issuer's business domicile, etc. - by their own conditions and/ or position of support/ assistance for the issuer.

E) Order of Seniority in Debt Payment

The likelihood of debt payment can be different between given debts of the same issuer. The likelihood of debt payment for an individual debt is dependent on the issuer's discretion, and/ or its rank relative to other debts of the same issuer in the order of seniority in principal/ interest payment which is determined by design as financial product or by laws, etc.

A) Business Bases

The credit rating is subject to alteration if there is improvement or deterioration of the issuer's business bases, since its revenue, etc. may improve or deteriorate by the change in its business management policies, clients' preferences, competitive situation, or a technological innovation. The resultant alteration of the credit rating is usually by a notch, with possibility of a few notches if and when the change in the business bases is large.

B) Financial Grounds and Asset Quality

The credit rating is subject to alteration if the issuer increases/ decreases its debt/ capital or vice versa and thereby makes its individual debt payment liability less or more bearable and its loss absorption capacity into the future decreased or increased. Also, the changes in the quality of asset under the issuer's holding may affect the credit rating, since such changes could raise or lower the likelihood of future loss of the issuer's financial grounds. The resultant alteration of the credit rating is usually by a

notch, with possibility of a few notches if and when the change in the financial grounds and/ or asset quality is large.

C) Liquidity Positions

The credit rating is subject to alteration if there is a change in the issuer's financial management policy or in the relations with fund procurement sources and the change thereby makes its liquidity positions improve or deteriorate. The resultant alteration of the credit rating is usually by a notch, with possibility of a few notches if and when the change is large.

D) Related Parties' Status and Stance of Support/ Assistance for the Issuer

The credit rating is subject to alteration if there is a change in the issuer's parent company or subsidiary, guarantor or other provider of credit enhancement, or the government of the issuer's business domicile, or other related parties' own conditions and/ or position of support/ assistance for the issuer, and the change thereby makes its business bases, financial grounds and/ or liquidity positions improve or deteriorate, and/ or making the effectiveness of guarantee and other credit enhancement improve or deteriorate. The resultant alteration of the credit rating is usually a notch, with possibility of a few notches if and when the change is large.

E) Order of Seniority in Debt Payment and Non-Payment Forgiven by Contract

The credit rating is subject to alteration if there is a change in the rated debt's status in the order of seniority relative to other debts caused by the improvement/ deterioration of the issuer's financial condition. The resultant alteration of the credit rating is usually a notch, with possibility of a few notches if and when the change is large. Also, in case of the financial products for which non-payment of interest/ principal is contractually permissible, the credit rating is subject to alteration if and when the likelihood of such non-payment is projected to increase or decrease. The resultant alteration of the credit rating could be by a notch but often as much as a few notches.

F) Rise and Fall in General Economy and Markets

The credit rating is subject to alteration if there is a rise/ fall in the general economy and/ or the markets inducing the issuer's revenues/ expenses to increase/ decrease and vice versa, etc. The resultant alteration of the credit rating is usually by a notch, with possibility of a few notches if and when the change is exceptionally large.

G) Various Events

The credit rating is subject to alteration on occurrence of various events, such as change in the issuer's major shareholders, M&A and other organizational change, accident, violation of the law, litigation, legal/ regulatory change, natural disaster, etc., which are unforeseeable at the time when the credit rating is determined, causing a significant change on the issuer's business bases, financial grounds, etc. The resultant alteration of the credit rating could be by a notch but more often than not as much as a few notches.

The resultant change of the credit rating is most likely by a notch, as JCR speculates, but possibly as much as a few notches if there is a major change on the part of related parties, such as replacement, disappearance, some drastic improvement/ deterioration of financial grounds/ balances, etc.
